Key vocabulary

Gospel	The teaching of revelation of Jesus
lectern	A stand where the Bible is read from
New Testament	The second part of the Christian Bible, recording the life and teachings of Jesus
pulpit	An elevated platform from which a sermon is delivered
redemption	A release or rescue from sin
salvation	The act of saving or being saved from sin or evil
saviour	Someone who brings salvation
sermon	A written or spoken address on any Christian matter

I should know:

Christians believe:

- Jesus is the saviour of the world. This is good news.
- The Gospels are the books of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. They are found in the New Testament in the Bible and tell the stories of Jesus.
- Christians live by the Bible and by the teachings of Jesus.
- The teachings of Jesus have authority in their life.
