

What symbols and stories help Jewish people to remember their covenant with God?



I should know:

A **covenant** is a special promise between God and the Jewish people.

There are three key covenants: with Noah, Abraham, and Moses.

The **Ten Commandments** were part of the covenant with Moses.

A **mezuzah** on a door reminds Jewish people of their promises to God.

Shabbat is a weekly reminder of the covenant.

Passover and **Shavuot** are festivals that help Jews remember God's promises.

Explore the concept of covenant and how Jewish people keep their promise to God.

Explore the three main covenants of Judaism.

Create a Mezuzah to help me remember a promise.

Explain why Passover is important to Jewish people and how it is celebrated.

Explain why Shavuot is important to Jewish people and understand how it is celebrated.

Key vocabulary	
covenant	A special promise or agreement
Ten Commandments	Important rules given by God to help people live good lives
Mezuzah	A small container on a Jewish person's door that reminds them of God's promises
Shabbat	The Jewish day of rest from Friday evening to Saturday evening.
Passover	A festival remembering how God freed the Israelites from slavery in Egypt
Shavuot	A festival celebrating when God gave the Torah (Jewish laws) to Moses.
