


Prior Knowledge:

- Symbols of this are crosses on hot cross buns and palm crosses.
 - The cross is an important symbol for Christians.
 - On Good Friday Jesus died on the Cross
 - On Easter Sunday, Jesus rose again.
 - It is important to remember this and so celebrate Easter.
 - Easter symbolises salvation.
 - Jesus was sent to Earth to save people.
 - Jesus's name means God saves
 - Salvation means the act of saving.
- Know some Jews believe that:
- God wants to look after his people
 - God send signs to show he cares
 - Jews believe that
 - Moses was a leader of God's people
 - God sent a burning bush to talk to Moses
 - Moses was given a special job.



Key Knowledge:
