Prior Knowledge:

Christians believe in one God who created the world and cares about people.

God communicates with people in different ways (e.g. through the Bible, Jesus, prophets, prayer).

Jesus is central to Christian belief and is seen by Christians as: The Son of God, A teacher and guide, An intermediary between God and humans

Prophets in the Bible (such as Moses, Isaiah, or John the Baptist) were believed to: Receive messages from God and Guide people on how to live

The Bible is a source of guidance, believed by Christians to contain God's teachings.

Humanists do not believe in God or divine guidance.

People can make moral decisions using reason, empathy, and evidence and Humans are responsible for their own actions.

Opportunities for Spiritual Expression

Creation Vocabulary

	A person who acts as a link between people and God, helping to pass on messages or guidance.
	A person chosen by God to deliver God's messages to people, often guiding them on how to live.
	When God shows or tells something important to a person so they can understand God's will.
	Help or advice that shows people the right way to live or make good choices.

Some Christians believe that

- A prophet listens to God
- Prophets in the Old testament tell of God's plan for the future.
- Prophets spoke of a messiah who would be the rescuer.
- The Messiah would walk on Earth as God's rescuer.
- The bible records the prophecies, which include details of the messiah's birth.
- Messiah is the promise of incarnation on earth.
- Jesus is the Messiah

some Humanists believe that

- There is no divine being.
- Personal responsibility and the use of reason and evidence to understand the world supports them to make ethical decisions.

Human experience and rational thought are the primary sources of knowledge and guidance.

Generalisation:

Christians believe Prophets deliver messages from God.

Humanists believe happiness is the goal of life.
