

Queen Elizabeth I had a seriously sweet tooth which caused her teeth to go black so she had to have wooden false teeth. Elizabeth I spoke 5 different languages by the age of 7. She also survived a deadly disease called smallpox.



Queen Victoria unexpectedly became queen at the age of just 18. She spoke German until she was three. She was just 5 feet tall. After her much-loved husband, Albert, died when she was just 42, she wore black clothes for the rest of her life.

Tudor	Kings and queen who ruled mainly in 1500s. Queen Elizabeth was the last Tudor.
Victorian	Long period mainly in 1800s named after the Queen.
